As the CEO of Farmer Line Technologies, she pioneers the use of solar-powered, AI-driven devices for crop pest and disease detection, all with a noble vision: to alleviate hunger among over a million smallholder farmers. Her journey is a deeply personal one, sparked by her childhood experiences of grappling with farm losses due to pests and diseases in the breathtaking Aberdare mountains. Today, her groundbreaking technology has made a profound impact on the lives of over 60,000 Kenyan farmers.

In recognition of her remarkable achievements, Esther Kimani was bestowed with a generous cash prize of \$75,000 (equivalent to approximately Sh10.7 million). This invaluable support will empower her company to reach out to over 200,000 farmers and embark on an expansion journey that extends to other African nations, including Namibia, Uganda, Nigeria, and Rwanda. It's noteworthy that Esther Kimani once graced the halls of the University of Eldoret, pursuing her BSc. in Computer Science. Her journey is a testament to the power of innovation and dedication in transforming lives and communities.

University Hosted a Public Lecture on The Question of Intelligent Design






